
Los Zetas represent a new generation of ruthless, sadistic pragmatists in Mexico and Central America who are impelling a tectonic shift among drug trafficking organisations in the Americas. Mexico's marines have taken down the cartel's top leaders; nevertheless, these capos have altered how criminal business is conducted in the Western Hemisphere. This narrative brings an unprecedented level of detail in describing how Los Zetas became Mexico's most diabolical criminal organisation. Despite crippling losses Los Zetas still dominate Nuevo Laredo, the major portal for legal and illegal bilateral commerce. They also work hand-in-glove with the underworld in Guatemala, El Salvador, and Honduras, as well as with gangs like the Maras Salvatruchas.





Mass incarceration and lower crime rates have not made city dwellers feel safe. Programmes designed to deal with this problem focus on increased police protection. In this study, Dan A. Lewis & Greta W. Salem question the validity of these assumptions and the effectiveness of this approach. Their five-year investigation challenged theories that focused only on the psychological responses to victimisation and failed to take into account the social and political environments within which such fears are created. They consider ways to restore the control that community residents feel they have lost and consider the possibilities for a more equitable distribution of security in urban areas.
